Course Summary:	<i>diplomacy</i> The aim of the study course is to create an understanding of the main political processes and the main institutions of the European Union and their importance in the business environment. After the completion of the study course, students will develop knowledge and skills in the international and European legal business environment, law and policy development, including current topics areas such as competitiveness, sustainability, the European Green Course, financing options and the development of standardized rules and contracts. During the study course, students will be invited to visit the relevant Latvian, European and international institutions (study trips - according to the possibilities of the relevant study year). As part of the study course, students will strengthen the skill of critical thinking and legal reasoning, the basic skills of applying and interpreting laws, the basics of legal creative initiatives and lobbying, business negotiations, dispute prevention and resolution skills, they will find appropriate external financial sources for business development, they will get to know the EU platforms where to search for information and apply for financing, including tenders, procurement, and will perform independent and team work online and in person. The study course is related to the legal environment of international business and international institutions, based on examples and court judgments and mock situations, guided by the lecturers' professional and academic
