An in-depth legal analysis will be conducted regarding issues of freedom of expression and its interaction with the rights of individual to protect his/her private life. The course covers also the following issues: duty of care for journalists and media, protection of journalistic sources, issues of intellectual property rights related to everyday's work of journalists and other communication professionals, especially those of copyright and related rights and other relevant legal issues, including protection of trade secrets. The theoretical information will be supplemented by the broad case law of the European Court of Human Rights (ECHR), the Constitutional Court of Latvia, other Latvian courts and some national courts of different countries. The practical skills will be developed with the help of case studies, group work etc.
